

4 Best Broad Jumpers Give Northwestern Title Sendoff

The other qualifiers were Don Zielinski, of Redford, 20 feet 2¾; and Willie Hardy, Southwestern, 20-1½.

"Shucks, that was nothing, we have more broad jumpers than anything else," said Coach Jimmy Russell when others congratulated Jim on the showing. "Our best boy is ineligible and another was kept out by the rule limiting a school to four entries in an event. Otherwise we might have slammed the field."

"That gives Northwestern a good chance to win," said Bruce Waha, of Redford. His trackmen led with 13 qualifiers. Mackenzie had 11; Northwestern 9; Chadsey 8. Southwestern placed six in finals while

Cody the defending champion, and Western each had five. Cass gained four and Cooley two.

No trials were held in the high jump, pole vault, the sprint and medley relays.

REDFORD BEST IN MILE

The strongest events for Redford were the mile, with four of the 12 qualifiers; the half, with three out of nine; and the shot put, with two of seven.

Points in the finals are counted 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Pershing, the Metro champion, was favored to win the east side title today.
