

3rd Title in Row for St. Joseph's

When the semester ends in June, St. Joseph's High will lose the coach and the athlete who have made the school a power in track.

Brother Christopher, the coach, sails for Rome for a year of study at the mother house of the Christian Brothers while Bishop Young, the athlete, receives his diploma.

The two have been responsible for St. Joseph's winning three successive Parochial League track titles.

The third came yesterday in U. of D. Stadium as St. Joseph's piled up 59 points to 42½ for runner-up De La Salle.

Nine other schools of the 18 in the 10th annual meet also

scored. Servite had 19 5-6; Notre Dame 19¼; Orchard Lake St. Mary's 19 1-6; Austin 12; St. Michael's 8; St. Paul's 6¾; Cathedral 6; Mt. Clemens St. Mary 1¾, and Redeemer ¾.

"I came to St. Joseph's five years ago and the boys won the championship for me the first year," Brother Christopher said. "We were second to Servite the next year and Young has led us to three titles. He's the best athlete in the school's history."

Despite a pulled leg muscle that kept him out of competition most of the season, the 18-year-old Young ran off with the 100 and 220-yard dashes, then anchored St. Joseph's sprint relay to victory for the third year in a row.

Young won the 100 in :10.4, equaled the record of :22.5 in the 220, and finished the day by leading the team to a record-breaking 1:34.2 clocking in the half-mile relay. He helped set the previous mark of 1:34.7 two years ago.

The St. Joseph's sprinter had 11¼ points. The individual leader was Mike Pyne, of Servite, with 13½. Mike took the high jump and pole vault Wednesday when he also was fourth
