

Redford Track Team Rolls to First Title on West Side

Coach Bruce Waha had predicted his Redford High team would win its first Metropolitan League West Side track meet yesterday "if the boys do well in four events—the medley and sprint relays, the half mile and mile runs."

It turned out better than Waha hoped. Redford scored 50 points in the four tests, winning both relays, placing first and fourth in the mile, then second, third and fourth in the 880.

Redford finished with 94 1-5 points to Mackenzie's 70 1-5.

Northwestern had 62 1-5; Chadsey 51; Cody 40; Southwestern 39; Cass 28; Western 10 3/4, and Cooley 8.

"They more than fulfilled my expectations as I didn't think we would win either relay or do so well in the half," the Redford coach said. "I also hadn't counted on Kirk Armstrong winning the quarter mile."

Redford failed to qualify for 100, 220 and high jump of the league championships at Mackenzie next Tuesday.

The meet produced two double winners—Henry Carr, of Southwestern, in the 100 and 220, and Leon Fields, of Chadsey, in the high and low hurdles. Each scored 20 points.

Jim Oliphant, of Mackenzie, was the leader with 34 points. He was second in both hurdle races, tying for first in the high jump and pole vault.

State, Metro Champs Duel in U. of D. Prep Relays

The University of Detroit high school relays tomorrow will match champions in the climax to a highly successful prep track season.

The meet will bring together Pontiac, four-time winner of the state Class A championship, and Pershing, defending champion of the Metropolitan League.

While these two teams figure to play leading roles, the supporting cast is equally impressive. Ten other Metropolitan League teams have entered contestants against some of the top suburban and Parochial League trackmen.

Among the outstanding individual performers will be Bill Alcorn, of Birmingham, who raised the state pole vault record to 12 feet, 11 3/4 inches

in the state meet at Ann Arbor last Saturday.

Pontiac will be led by Bob Manning, who formerly competed in the Metropolitan League. Manning won both dashes in the state meet and has clocked in 9.8 in the 100-yard dash. Other Pontiac stars are miler Larry Beamer and hurdler Dan Sowell.

The hurdles promise to be outstanding events. Competing with Sowell will be East Detroit's Gary Ballman, second in the state meet, and Pershing's Lonnie Sanders.

A total of 36 teams and 600 boys will compete. Pershing is the defending Class A champion and River Rouge the B title-holder. Field events will start at 10 a.m. and the running events at 1 p.m.
