league mark of :21.7 in the 220. Miller had 20 points.

A strong wind aided the sprinters and referee Leighton Boyd felt the times should not be recognized. League supervisor James Stout and George Mead, divisional director of health and physical education, disagreed.

"As far as I know we've never taken wind into consideration in our records," Stout said, and Mead upheld him. Leonard Alkon, of Northern, set the previous time of :09.9 in 1940.

"Clark beat me in the sim-final races Tuesday, but I felt pretty good today," the Cass sprinter said. "I was just tense enough to get off the starting blocks quickly."

Mike Dinkins, of Northeastern, was second to Miller with 18<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> on first in high hurdles, third in broad jump, fifth in low hurdles and a four-way tie for fifth in the high jump. Lonnie Sanders, of Pershing, and Felton Rogers, of Eastern, each had 17. Leon Fields, of Chadsey, and Clark each scored 16.

Co-captain Don Zielinski came up with the "winning" suggestion when Redford High track athletes wondered what they could give their coach, Bruce Waha, for his marriage next week to Joan Molr.

"Let's give him all the championships," Don said. This consisted of the West Side meet, U. of D. Relays and the Metropolitan League finals.

And that's what the boys did. They ran off with the West Side competition, edged Pontiac by half a point in the relays and gained an easy victory in the Metro meet at Mackenzie yesterday.

"This is the best present you could give me," Waha said after receiving the team trophy from Zielinski and Co-captain Louis Molnar.

### WINNERS

Redford won two events, Molnar taking the mile run and Len Cranston leading in the shotput, while scoring 69½ points to 38¾ for Chadsey, which surprised by placing second. Pershing, last year's champion, was third with 35½.

Other scores: Northwestern 33½; Denby 31½; Cass 28; Northern 24; Northeastern 22½; Mumford 22; Cody 21; Eastern 18; Mackenzie 17¾; Southeastern 15; Central 14; Southwestern 4; Western 4; and Cooley 2¾.

"The boys scored a lot more points than I expected," Waha remarked. "I thought we'd get about 54 points and that would be enough to win."

## Martinez' Pilot Warns Rival Akins

ST. LOUIS, June 6.—(UPI)—Fic Bill Daly threatens to jump into the ring tonight and stop the welterweight title fight between Vince Martinez and Virgil Akins if Akins uses rabbit and kidney punches. The bout will be on WWJ-TV, channel, 4 at 9.

Daly manages 2-1 underdog Martinez of Paterson, N.J., who will face Akins, of St. Louis, over 15 rounds for the vacant welterweight crown. A crowd of 10,000 and a gate of \$65,000 are expected.
