

Prep Hurdler Almost

Warren (Rex) Cawley took another major step Thursday toward a national high school record in the 120-yard high hurdles.

The record effort could come Saturday at the Mansfield (O.) Relays.

Cawley, talented Farmington High senior, was clocked in :14.1 over a soft Southfield High track. The national mark which Cawley is shooting at is :13.9.

Cawley was just 7/10ths of a second off the world record of :13.4 held by Jack Davis, of Bakersfield, Calif.

Cawley also won the 180-yard low hurdles in :18.9, a tenth of a second better than his own state record. The national schoolboy record in the lows is :18.5.

WITH CAWLEY showing the way Farmington easily defeated Southfield, 61 1/3 to 40 2/3. Mike Agee won both dashes for Farmington.

Henry Carr, Southwestern High sophomore, won the 100, 220 and broad jump and Norm Dozier captured both hurdles in leading the Prospectors to a 56-52 upset of Northwestern in a City League feature.

Northwestern might have

won had not Art Norman fell on the final hurdle in the highs when he was leading by five yards.

Felton Rodgers turned in a triple for Eastern as the Indians walloped Southeastern at Belle Isle, 86-22. Rodgers won both hurdles and the broad jump.
