Two athletes starred as Southwestern High defeated Cody, 64-49, in a dual track meet yesterday. Henry Carr scored 16 1/4 points, Jim Smith getting 13 1/4. Carr led in the 100, 220 and broad jump while Smith won the 440, tied for first in the high jump and was second in the broad jump. Both were on the sprint relay.

A pair of stars also led the way in Eastern's 79-30 victory over Northeastern. Felton Rogers took both hurdle races, tying for first in the high jump. Larry Knuckle won the sprints.

Mumford picked up nine firsts and beat Central, 69-40. Homer Heard ran the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds flat, leaped 21 feet 10 in the broad jump and ran on the relay.

Mackenzie won from Chadsey, 64 3/4 to 44 1/4 with Gordon Kummer first in the high and low hurdles.

Dave Burris and Steve Meyer each collected 15 points as Berkley slipped past Southfield by a third of a point, 53 2/3 to 54 1/3. Burris won the high hurdles, shot put and high jump. Meyer taking the 100, 220 and broad jump.

Farmington downed Waterford, 62-47, as Warren Cawley scored 16 points and Mike Agee 14 1/4. Cawley had firsts in the hurdle races, placing second in the high and broad jumps. Agee led in the 220 and broad jump, was second in the 100 and ran on the winning relay.

Trenon defeated Livonia Bentley, 6-1, to remain unbeaten in Suburban Six League tennis. Jim Eveland, of Bentley, whipped Jerry Mazo, 2-6, 6-0, 6-0, in the No. 1 singles. Cranbrook swept four singles and three doubles to blank Oak Park, 7-0.
