

Cawley Finally Does It!

Hurdler Equals National Mark

Warren (Rex) Cawley, the celebrated Farmington High hurdler, cut himself a piece of national fame Saturday at Thurston High.

Cawley equaled the national high school record in the 120-yard high hurdles when he turned in preliminary and final performances of 13.9 seconds.

MEET DIRECTOR Bob Parks had four watches on Cawley and his wind velometer read 3.28 mph in the preliminaries and 1.37 mph in the finals.

On two previous weekends Cawley had been deprived of national honors when a tailwind exceeded the 4.473 mph allowed under national rules.

Cawley won both the high and low hurdles. He also won the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 1/2 inch and anchored his winning 880-yard relay team.

Bill Alcorn, Birmingham's pole vaulter, soared 13 feet 1 inch while Paul Underwood of South Lyons turned in a fine 2:01.5 half mile in Class B.

Team championships went to Pontiac in Class A and Cranbrook in Class B. Cranbrook won 10 of 16 firsts and scored in every event.
