

# Farmington Winner in Class A at CMC

MT. PLEASANT — (AP) — A disqualification in the final event gave Farmington a fourth place finish in the 880-yard relay and the Class A high school track championship Saturday in the 19th annual Central Michigan Relays.

The suburban Detroit school scored 47 points.

Birmingham was disqualified in the 880 and Farmington moved up to fourth. Had Birmingham placed fourth, the Maples would have won the title. Birmingham was runner-up with 44 points. Lansing Sexton was third with 43 points.

Another suburban Detroit school, Crankbrook, won the Class B title. Flint Dye won the Class C crown and Pickford took Class D honors in competition Friday.

Warren (Rex) Cawley was the standout of Saturday's meet. The Farmington senior twice bettered national schoolboy records, in both the high and low hurdles, but because of high winds the records were denied.

Cawley was clocked in :13.7 and :13.8 in the high hurdles. The national high school record :13.9. He ran the 180-yard low hurdles in :18.3 and :18.4. That national record is :18.5.

Cawley also shared first place in the high jump and anchored a winning 660-yard relay team in accounting for 15½ points.

Bill Alcorn's pole vault of 12 feet, 9½-inches set a meet record for Birmingham.

Crankbrook won both the mile and 660-yard relays to edge past both Willow Run and River Rouge which shared second in the Class B competition with 26 points each.
