Winds Cancel 2 U.S. Prep Track Records

MT. PLEASANT, May 2. — Farmington, led by hurdle star Warren Cawley, and Cranbrook, with team balance, took top honors here today in the 19th annual Central Michigan Relays.

Although Cawley was deprived of two national scholastic records because of aiding winds, he helped his team pile up 47 points to capture the Class A title. Cranbrook tallied 41 points in winning the Class B crown.

BIRMINGHAM 2ND

Birmingham was second in Class A with 44 points, one better than Lansing Sexton. Walled Lake was fourth with 31½. River Rouge and Willow Run tied for runner-up honors

in Class B with totals of 36 points apiece.

Cawley, the state record-holder in the 180-yard low hurdles and more recently a double winner in the Mansfield, O., Relays, flashed through his specialty in 18.4 seconds in a preliminary heat to smash the national mark by a tenth of a second. He later equaled the record in winning the event.

He then clocked a remarkable 13.75 seconds in winning the 120 highs, beating the national standard by nearly two-tenths of a second.

A tailwind, recorder from 6 to 8 miles an hour, canceled out Cawley's bid for nationwide recognition.

ANCHORS TEAM

Cawley also anchored Farmington's central relay team to a first-place time of 1:07.7 and

finished in a five-way tie in the Class A high jump.

Cranbrook took only two firsts, in the 660-yard and mile relays, but backed them up with other point-winning placements. The Cranbrook mile relay ran to a record clocking of 3:33.3.
