Wind Deprives Hurdler Of National Prep Marks G

Cawley Big Star At Relays

Paces Farmington To Class A Win.

MT. PLEASANT—Four times gusty wind deprived remarkable Warren Cawley from establishing national high school hurdle records here yesterday, so the star Farmington performer had to be satisfied with leading his team to the Central Michigan Relays Class A team championship. 、

Cawley undercut national high school records in the 120-yard high hurdles and 180-yard low hurdles both in preliminaries and finals, but a wind of from eight to 11 miles an hour ruled out any chance that the marks could be submitted for recognition.

He ran the high hurdles in 13.75 seconds in the finals after a 13.8 clocking in the preliminaries, and posted an 18.25 seconds time in the low hurdle finals after an 18.4 preliminary

The national record in the high hurdles is 13.9 and in the low hurdles, 18.5.
