

SS. Peter Paul Wins Triangular Meet

Saginaw SS. Peter & Paul swept 10 of 13 events in overwhelming Holy Rosary and Bay City St. James in a triangular track meet at Alumni Field yesterday afternoon.

The Crusaders piled up 76½ points to 29¼ each for Holy Rosary and St. James.

Al Young and Paul Halas were double winners for SS. Peter & Paul. Young won both the 120 high hurdle and the 180 low hurdle events, while Halas sprinted home first in the 100 and 220 yard dashes. Other first place winners for the Crusaders included Howard Foley in the mile, Gerry Jones in the

shot put, Lynn Mack in the high jump, and Ethan Marlette in the broad jump. In addition, both the medley and 880 relays were won by SS. Peter & Paul.

The Greyhounds won two of the other three firsts, Jerry Knoll taking the 440 in 57.7 seconds and Ray Kinney the 880. St. James' only first was scored by Terry McPeak with a 9-6 jump in the pole vault.
