# Pontiac Nips Redford in U-D Relays

Pontiac Central, edged a year ago by a half point, turned the tables on defending champion Redford by the slender margin of 2½ points for the Class A crown in the third annual U. of D. Relays Saturday in Titan Stadium. Coach Dean Wilson's sophomore-studded squad rolled up 34 points to Redford's 31½.

The final 880-yard relay on the 11-event program decided the issue. Going into it Pontiac carried a slim half point lead over the defenders. The new champions picked up three decisive points for a third-place finish to Redford's two for fourth as Mumford won the event and was trailed by Southwestern.

Ecorse, coached by Gene Lucarelli, dominated the Class B field by a lopsided margin over Lake Shore, 51-37. Lutheran West and Bloomfield Hills shared third position with 12 points each.

Seven records were shattered during the seven-hour program which attracted around 520 athletes and 27 school entries. Pontiac set one of four in Class A, winning the shotput with an aggregate distance of 151 feet, 5½ inches. Bill Pritchett had the best individual effort, 51 feet, 2½.

Mumford grabbed a pair of marks by winning the 880 in

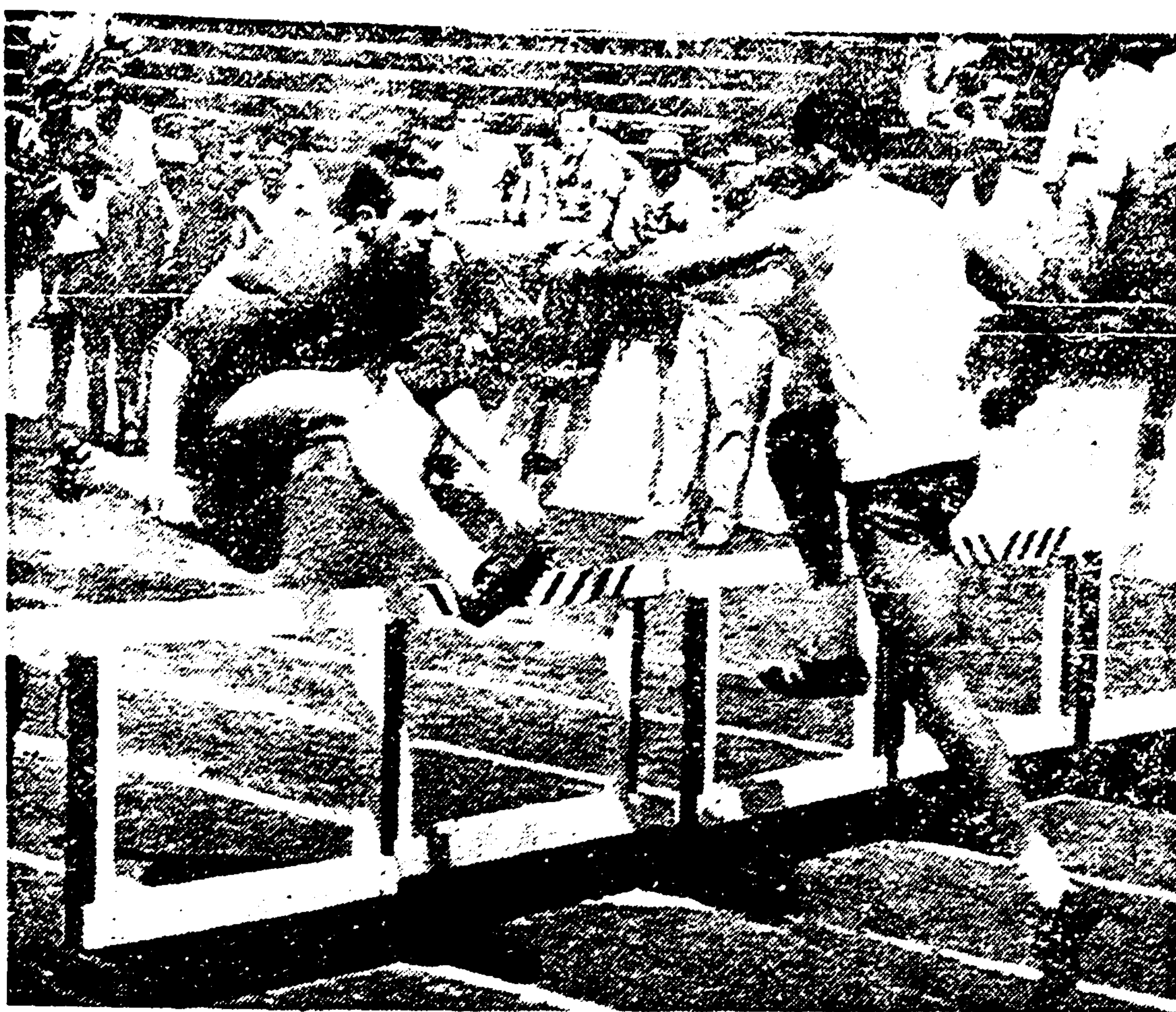
