

Sports Stars Are Priming For Big Ones

It's Windup Time In Track, Golf; Netters Go Longer

Ann Arbor area track, golf and tennis prepsters will scatter to various points of the state this weekend in search of honors for their schools and themselves in state championship competition.

Class A and B track battling is scheduled at Michigan State University at East Lansing on Saturday while C and D schools will compete at Central Michigan College at Mt. Pleasant on the same day.

All golf matches are slated for Port Huron on Saturday with Class A and C-D golfers hitting at the Black River Country Club and Class B qualifiers participating at the Port Huron Golf Club course.

Regional tennis matches for local and area squads will be held at Monroe and Dearborn. Finals in tennis will not be held until Friday and Saturday, June 5-6, at Kalamazoo College.

For the thinclads, preliminary action will start at 10:30 a.m. at both MSU and CMC. Finals will start at 1:30 p.m. The two Class A schools in this area, Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti, will send eight and five youths respectively, to the state meet.

In Class B, Willow Run will send 11, Milan eight, Howell four and Brighton and South Lyon one each.

In Class C, six trackmen will represent Ypsilanti Roosevelt and four will represent U High. Lincoln Consolidated has qualified four boys and Chelsea has qualified two relay teams. Dexter, Clinton and Pinckney will each send one man and Saline has qualified its medley-relay team.

Ann Arbor's golf team, by winning the Class A Brighton regional qualified for state final competition at Port Huron. U High's squad also got on the select list by placing third in the C-D Regional. Brighton was second in Class B.

In tennis, the Pioneers will compete at Monroe as will Ypsilanti. University High and Ypsilanti Roosevelt have been designated for the Dearborn Regional. Monroe will be host to Classes A and B while Dearborn will be host to Classes A and C-D.

Ann Arbor High's chances of taking points in the track finals will rest largely with Willie Haywood in the shot put, Dempsey Taylor in the 440 and Jesse Campbell, an improving high jumper. Lavelle Moore won the high hurdles in the Regional here with a time of 15.6 seconds, but there will be tough competition for him at MSU. Warren Cawley of Farmington has recorded a sensational time of :13.9 in the high hurdles.

Other Pioneers making the trip to East Lansing will include Brian Westfield who will compete in the broad jump, James Dixon in the high jump, Steve Lowe in the 880 and Carl Allen in the mile.

University High will be represented by Sandy MacKay in the hurdles, Pete Andrews in the broad jump and Carl Clarke and John McClusky in the 440.

Ann Arbor High's Regional champion golf team includes Chuck Newton, Bill Hallock, Jim Filipiak and Gilbert Dean. U High's qualifiers were Frank Winchester, Jeff Fischer, Bill Rice and Dick Wilkinson.
