

Cawley Wins 3 Events

EAST LANSING, May 23—The weather man again reared his ugly head today and for the "umpteenth" time this spring, kept Warren (Rex) Cawley of Farmington from what appeared sure-fire national and Michigan interscholastic track records.

But the suburban buzzbomb still emerged as the individual hero of the 52d annual State prep championships in which Flint Central captured the Class A team crown and the Class B prize went to Willow Run.

IN CAPSULE FORM, this was the Cawley story today:

- Scored expected victories by over 10-yard margins in both the high and low hurdles.
- Gained a last-ditch triumph in the broad jump.
- Ran a brilliant anchor leg to bring Farmington from almost no place to victory in the 880-yard relay.

In the relay, Cawley had to make up 12 yards in his 220-yard stint. With the crowd according him the greatest ovation of the day, Cawley roared down the outside to hit the tape a foot in front of favored Flint Northern.

Thanks to Cawley, Farmington compiled 22 points for third place as Flint Central took its first crown with 35.

Second went to Flint Northern with 28.

Ron Watkins led Flint Central with victories in the 100 and 220-yard dashes. He also ran on Central's winning medley relay. His time of 21.8 seconds in the 220 was a tenth under the State mark which has stood since 1925.

DASHIMEN NAOSBA Poe and Otis Harrison sparked Willow Run, which, like Flint Central made it into the champions' circle for the first time.

Willow Run totaled 34½ points to second place Cranbrook's 21. River Rouge had 20 for third. Ecorse was next with 19¾.

Poe won the 100 and was third in the 220. Harrison took the 220 and was second in the 100. With Mel Austin and Cliff Bellows, they combined to take the sprint relay.

Herman Brooks copped the broad jump with a leap of 21 feet 7¼ inches to add to the Willow Run total.

Perhaps Cawley had to expect the elements would turn sour on him in his final major bid for prep glory.

TODAY, HE HAD to operate on a muddy track, and into a head wind. He still tied the 120-yard high hurdle mark of 14.4 seconds, set three years

ago by Hayes Jones, and won the lows in 19.2 seconds, two-tenths under his own state standard of a year ago.

Bill Alcorn of Birmingham High clipped his own Class A mark when he cleared 13 feet 3 inches to erase the old standard of 12 feet 11 1/4 inches made last year.
