

Flint Central 'A' Champion

Cawley Piles Up 18 Points

EAST LANSING—AP—Flint Central, led by an All-State football halfback, won the first State Class A track title in the school's history Saturday.

Speedster Ron Watkins won the 100 and 220-yard dashes and ran a 220 leg on the victorious medley relay team as the Indians slammed down Pontiac Central's bid for a fifth straight championship.

Flint Northern finished second for the sixth consecutive year.

Watkins, a muscular 170-pounder headed for Michigan State, piled up 12 points on his own before taking part in the medley relay event.

But he had to give up individual honors to Warren (Rex) Cawley, a brilliant all-around performer from Farmington High. The brush-cut flash almost single-handedly carried his team into a surprising third-place finish.

He won the broad jump and hurdles events, then capped a sensational show that delighted a chilled crowd at Ralph Young field by running the anchor leg of the 880-yard relay event. Cawley made up a deficit of a dozen yards as his team captured the relay event, after Cawley himself piled up 18 points on his individual performances.
