

S'WESTERN'S CARR RUNS 220 IN :21.7

Prep Sprinter Ties League Record

Coach Vernon (Bucky) Walters, of Southwestern, was worried yesterday when his all-around star, Henry Carr, twisted his ankle slightly while getting off a 22-foot 6½-inch jump in the Public School League West Side track trials at Mackenzie.

said. He was relieved when the 16-year-old sophomore led 100-yard dash qualifiers in 10.2 seconds on a heavy track, then climaxed his efforts by sprinting a heat of the 220 in :21.7. The time, caught by five watches, equaled the league record set in 1954 by Marvin Pettway, of Miller, and tied by Bob Manning, of Western, in 1956 and Claude Miller, of Cass, last year.

"Henry most certainly would have broken 10 seconds and set a 220 record if the track had been faster and he hadn't been hurt," Walters said.

"I told him to coast in his semifinal 220 and he was caught in :24.1. He'll be OK. His good jump should stand up and he probably won't take his three jumps in the finals."

Walters also coached Manning when he won the league

100 and 220 two years in a row in 1955 and '56.

"Bob was good but Henry is even better. He has a great future in track," the coach declared.

Carr should be a triple winner in the finals but the team honors will go to Redford. The defending league champions qualified 19 boys in nine events. No trials were held in the high jump, pole vault, sprint and medley relays.

Redford failed to place only in the 220. Redford qualified

three in the shot put and low hurdles; four in the mile and half mile; two in the 440; and one each in the broad jump, 110-yard dash and high hurdles.

Mackenzie gained 10 places; Southwestern 8; Chadsey 6; Northwestern, Cody and Cooley 5, and Western 4.

An injury ended Lew Fields' hopes of retaining his low hurdles title. The Chadsey athlete suffered a recurrence of a leg injury during the heats and was forced to withdraw from the meet.
