

6-9 Ace Standout In Meet

Holy Redeemer's 6-9 giant junior, Bill Chmielewski, was the individual standout yesterday in the first day of the Catholic League's annual track and field meet at U. D. Stadium.

In addition to setting one of two loop records smashed yesterday, Chmielewski added another victory and also qualified for today's finals in both the low and high hurdles.

CHMIELEWSKI cleared the high jump bar at six feet, 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches for his record performance. Angelo Matera, of DeLaSalle, came up with the other new league standard with a 21-foot-11-inch broad jump.

Chmielewski also won the shot put with a heave of 47 feet, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

DeLaSalle jumped to the early lead in the team event by scoring 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ points to runnerup Redeemer's 10. Austin had seven.

LaSalle, attempting to end St. Joseph's three-year reign as champion, picked up six of the 24 qualifying spots in the dashes and hurdles.

However, St. Joseph (which has six points) and U. of D. High are both expected to be heard from in today's running events which start at 4 p.m.
