St. Thomas Advances To Finals

A veteran Ann Arbor St. Thomas baseball squad, with Joe Frick tossing a one-hitter and fanning 10 batters, downed Visitation yesterday, 4-1, to earn the right to advance in the Catholic League's Second Division finals.

Walt Bicker's two-run triple in the fifth inning was the deciding blow as the Southwest champs eliminated West Side Hamp Visitation.

St. Thomas will meet the winner of the East Side race—either Nativity or St. Philip—next week for the Second Division title.

UNDEFEATED Nativity, however, needs only a victory over Detroit St. Thomas to insure itself the playoff spot, landing St. Philip its first defeat of the season, and first loop defeat since 1956, yesterday by a 4-0 score.

Righthander Vince Callahan pitched the whitewashing. Callahan was the last pitcher to beat St. Philip in league play back in 1956 when Vince was a freshman.

It's Easy Time for Mumford Thinclads

Mumford High's 880-yard relay team, running in the final event, capped a beautiful day for the Mustang thinclads yesterday.

The relay unit ran the event in record time as Mumford breezed to its first East Side track championship in the Metropolitan League.

Mumford scored in 12 of the 13 events and totaled 116 points while runnerup Eastern had 82½ and Pershing was third with 77.

FOLLOWING them in order were Central with 38, Northern 26, Northeastern 23½, Cass Tech 18½, Denby 17 and Osborn 4.

The time of 1:29.3 established by Mumford's crack 880 relay squad of Homer Heard, Jim Hampton, Dave Shevitz and Ken Burnley was one of three records smashed on Pershing High's track yesterday.

Eastern's Felton Rogers, a football and basketball star who was the meet's individual standout with three first places, grabbed one of the new marks when he high jumped 6 feet, 6 inches. In addition, he captured both hurdles and ran a leg on Eastern's third-place 880-yard relay team.

The West Side determines its champion today at Mackenzie High's field. Field events start at 2 p.m. and running events at 3:30.
