

CAWLEY TOP STAR

Records Smashed in Champions Meet Here

Neither rain nor blackout could prevent the fourth annual JCC Champion of Champion prep track and field carnival from becoming a record-smashing success at Kalamazoo College's Angell Field.

The 900 fans who braved inclement weather to view the meet which matched the state's top prep track and field performers, from all enrollment classes, were treated to a gala show, part of which was conducted in semi-darkness during a 35-minute power failure.

EIGHT MEET records were bettered, another equaled in the meet as well as two local city and school records.

Warren (Rex) Cawley, Farmington's great all-round star, won the Gazette award as the outstanding performer in the meet. He won the high hurdles in :14.4 seconds, the lows in :19.3 and ran a :21.4 anchor leg on the winning 880-yard relay team. Crawley also won the outstanding performer trophy for his school last year.

Pressing Cawley for honors was South Haven sprint star

Roger (Skip) Williams, who won the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds flat and the 220 in :22.3.

Other sensational performances on a soggy evening included:

A shot put of 55 feet, three inches by Dowagiac's 282-pound Dave Behrman. U. High's Tom Brown was second with a heave of 54-4½, a new school and city record.

A 1.57.3 half-mile (better than the listed Class A state mark) by Martin Hammerstein of Bedford Township High in Temperance, Mich.

Kalamazoo Central's school and city record time of 2:30.6 in the medley relay. Bob Gardner, Bernie Daggett, Joe Palmore and Howard Reno made up the team, and.

A pole vault of 13 feet, one and one-half inches by Birmingham's great Bill Alcorn, and a broad jump of 22 feet, six and one-half inches by Battle Creek's John Love.
