While at Cleveland East Tech 26 years ago, Owens established dash records which are still on the ledgers of many of the Midwest's top track carnivals. Cawley, a senior at Willow Run, Saturday set records in both sprints. His 100-meter was a field record—the fastest 100 ever turned in at Burton Field by a schoolboy or collegian.

Harrison also posted a 22.2 record in the 200.

HE WAS AIDED, however, by a six-mile tailwind. Since wind velocity never had been measured in past meets, director Edwin Isaac said that the two records would be accepted.

The other two records belong to Farmington's Warren Cawley, the state's foremost hurdler. Cawley posted a 13.8 effort in the 120-yard high hurdle and a 15.5 in the 180-yard low run around a curve.

His high-hurdle record was three-tenths of a second under the National high school mark, but for the second week the wind deprived him of recognition.

Last week he bettered both high and low hurdle marks at Central Michigan—but the wind there, too, was over the 4.475 mph limit.

NAY POE, of Willow Run, and Doris Reid, a freshman from Ferris, both turned in 3:10 centuries. Team championships went to Lansing Section in Class A, Lansing Everett in Class B, Grosse Ile, Class C, and Spring Arbor in Class D.

Coch J. Tinsot, of Grosse Ile, got a balanced effort from the 14 athletes he brought here. The Red Devils finished third last week at Mt. Pleasant, but scored in nine of 13 events Saturday and were in command all the way.

It was Grosse Ile's first title here since 1954.

The big point producer for Grosse Ile was Charley Felix, the meet's only triple winner.

Felix won both sections of the high and low hurdles, took first in the broad jump with a leap of 19 feet, 10 1/2 inches, and anchored his 880-yard relay team, which finished second.

In addition to the four meet records, 16 class records were broken.
