

Wind Again Wipes Out Cawley Bid

ALBION, May 9 — Farmington's Warren Cawley bettered the national scholastic record for the 120-yard high hurdles here this afternoon in the Albion College Invitation track meet, the second straight week he has done so, only to have his effort nullified again by a gust of wind.

Cawley flashed over the hurdle course in 13.6 seconds, beating the national high school mark by three-teenths of a second. It will, however, be considered a meet record.

Farmington finished second in the Class A team standings with 38 points to Lansing Sexton's 45. Battle Creek was third with 34.

Willow Run, leading in Class B up to the half-way mark, finished third in its class with 33½ points. Lansing Everett was first (39 points) and Milan second (33⅞).

Grosse Ile took the Class C crown with 46½ points to 37½ for Flint Dye and 31 for Ypsilanti Roosevelt. East Jackson, the defending 'C' champion, was fourth with 30.

Cawley came back to establish a meet record in the 180-yard low hurdle when he hit the tape in 19.3 seconds, beating his 1958 mark by nine-tenths of a second.

Willow Run's Otis Harrison set meet standards in the Class B 100-yard dash (9.8 seconds) and in the 220-yard dash (22.2). His teammate, Nay Poe, was clocked in 10 seconds flat in winning the second division of the 100.

Ferndale runners took both ends of the Class A 100, Dorey Reed slipping home in 10 flat and Tim Butts in 10.3. Reed took the 220 in 23.1.

Hazel Park's Frank Crowe took the Class A mile run in 4:41, while East Jackson's Dick Pickering, competing in Class C, set a meet record in his division with a time of 4:37.

Charlie Peltz starred in Grosse Ile's victory, taking both the Class C high hurdles and broad jump.
