

# Cawley 5th, 6th In AAU

## Hayes Is Also Hurdle Loser

BOULDER, Colo. — Warren Cawley, Farmington's brilliant runner, ran fifth in the 110-meter high hurdles and sixth in the 400-meter low hurdles in the National AAU track meet here Friday.

Cawley was pushed to the day's second fastest qualifying time, 51.3 seconds, to reach the finals of the lows, then didn't have enough left in the finals where New Mexico's Dick Howard set a meet record at :50.7.

IN THE highs Hayes Jones, Eastern Michigan's double winner in the NCAA, was edged in the final strides by Lee Calhoun of North Carolina College.

Ray Norton of San Jose State scored a 10.5-second victory in the 100-meters after defending champion Bobby Morrow ran dead last in his qualifying heat.

Except for an AAU-record shotput of 62 feet 2¼ inches by Olympic champion Parry O'Brien, the competition in mile-high Folsom Stadium was devoid of outstanding performances.
