

# Enthusiasm? No, Records

All this jazz about training and superior equipment apparently doesn't mean a thing to Metropolitan League track men.

At least on the basis of three record breaking performances yesterday in the league's preliminaries at Pershing High.

**HENRY CARR** of Southwestern who shattered both the 100 and 220-yard dash marks would turn in his suit for basketball or football any time. Jerry Burrell of Northern broke the broad jump record which had stood for 35 years even though his school doesn't have a jumping pit and is limited to working out in meets.

Even Burrell isn't enthusiastic about his specialty.

"I like the relay best," he said. "I tried out broad jumping two years ago when I first came out for the team just to see how it was. I did a little better than 21 feet and the coach (Buck Weaver) has had me doing it since."

Burrell cleared 22 feet, 11 1/4 inches in the broad jump. His jump was a quarter inch more than the previous record set in 1924 by Cliff Robinson of Northwestern.

Carr was completely unimpressed after running the 100 in 9.7 and the 220 in 21 seconds flat.

"HECK, I WASN'T nearly as tired as I usually am after running," he explained. "I guess I did all right today."

In winning his 100-yard dash event he did it in 9.7 for the third time this season. In the 220 he got off to a rather slow start, caught Homer Heard at about 90 yards and pulled away for a five-yard margin at the finish.

It doesn't make any difference since Metropolitan League marks are not recognized by the state association anyway, but Carr set both records with a tail wind in excess of the 4.48 mph. allowed by the state.

Lonnie Sanders of Pershing equalled the league record of 19.7 set last week in winning his heat of the 180-yard low hurdles. Felton Rogers, who set the mark, won his heat in 19.8.

**MUMFORD'S 880-YARD** relay team came close to its record, set last week, of 1:29.3 when Dave Shevitz, Heard, Ken Burnley and Jim Hampton ran the event just three-tenths of a second slower.
