

Area Preps Stun AAU Track Field

FORT WAYNE, Ind., June 6.

—Michigan high school athletes had a field day in the Midwest AAU meet here tonight. Led by sensational Rex Cawley, of Farmington, the youngsters more than held their own against top college competition.

Cawley raced to a triple victory in the hurdles. He won the 120-yard highs against a strong field in :14.1. His competition included former Michigan star Joel McNulty.

The 18-year-old, who holds all state high school hurdle records, came back to win the 220-yard low hurdles in :23.3, a time two-tenths of a second under the Big Ten record. He completed his triple with a victory in the 440-yard hurdles in :51.5.

Bill Alcorn, of Birmingham High, pole vaulted 13 feet, 6 inches, three inches over his state high school record, to place sixth in a field of 25 pole vaulters that included a number of 14-foot men.

Lincoln Park's Jerry Bashaw, who won the Class A mile last month, turned in his finest mile performance as he clocked a 4:22.9 in finishing sixth. He then came back to snare sixth place in the half-mile with a clocking of 1:57.6, well under the state high school record.
