

New Honors For Cawley

FORT WAYNE, Ind., June 8 (AP)—America's unending assembly line produced another youngster today who could give the top hurdlers in the world fits and starts by the 1960 Olympics.

His name is Warren Cawley. He is an 18-year-old high school senior from Farmington, Mich.

Young Warren turned up at the midwest A. A. U. open championships Saturday and won three events—the 440-lows in 51.5, the 220-yard lows in 23.3 and the 120-yard highs in 14.1

None of his times came close to world records, but every one of them was better than the performances turned in by Elias Gilbert of Winston Salem (N. C.) Teachers in the N. A. I. A. (small college) championships in Sioux Falls, S. D.

Gilbert, the United States' No. 1 hope in the hurdles events of the 1960 Olympics, won the same three events in leading his three-man team to the N. A. I. A. team championship.

He was caught in 53.6 for the 440, 24.6 for the 220 (he holds the world mark of 22.1 in this) and 14.6 for the 120.
