Fenton Second in Relays

Fenton High gave a hint of what may be expected in the Genesee County track picture this Spring, placing second in the fifth annual Eastern Michigan University Relays Friday at Ypsilanti. Class B, C and D schools competed.

The Tigers finished behind Ecorse (58½) with 20½ points while Durand (17¾) placed fifth, Bentley (11¾) ninth, Grand Blanc (10½) 10th, Kearsley (10) 11th and Swartz Creek and Davison, with three and 2½ points, respectively, out of the running.

Fenton's individual standouts were Bob Bruder who finished fifth in the high jump and the 65-yard high hurdles, Jim Cooley with a fourth in the mile, Jack Patton with a third in the shot put and the 880-yard relay team which took second in 1:38.2.

Durand's Bob Sherman was the individual star of the night with record firsts in the 65-yard high and low hurdles. In the highs he cracked the meet record of :8.3 with a mark of :8.0. In the lows he broke the mark of :7.8 with :7.5.

Other Durand finishes found its 880yard relay team in third place in 1:39.0 and Mike Wells tied for second in the pole vault with Bentley's Dick Schlegelmilch and Davison's Chuck Shaw at 11 feet.

Grand Blanc's Ron McCullick took fourth in the 65-yard low hurdles and Bart Vaughn tied for fourth in the broad jump. The Bobcats' shuttle hurdle relay finished second.

Swartz Creek's only point-getter was Walt Henry with a second-place tie in the high jump. He jumped 60%.
