

Wright's Vault Best in Relays

Ypsilanti — Jerry Wright won the pole vault and Ernie Carr scored in three events Saturday night as Flint Northern tied Ann Arbor for third place in the annual Huron Relays at Eastern Michigan University.

The schools finished with 27 points, behind Birmingham's winning 46 and Pontiac Central's 29½. Flint Central, defending champion, and Flint South-

western were scoreless.

Wright bagged the pole vault with a 12-foot effort while Carr took third in the low hurdles, fourth in the broad jump with a 20-foot 7½-inch leap and fifth in the 65-yard high hurdles.

The Vikings' Maurice Pea was second in the 60-yard dash.

Northern's 1:35.2 clocking was second in the 880 relay with Hugh Edwards, Joe Carter, Vern Walls and Pea running. The Vikings' mile relay club (Wilbur Martin, Carter, Ed Johnson and Edwards) was fifth at 3:42.4 and its sprint medley squad (Walls, Dennis McGee, Johnson and J. B. Elzy) was fifth in 2:40.1.

McGee fell and Elzy's 51.9 quarter-mile run, best of the Relays, helped the Vikings gain fifth place.

Forty-five schools competed.

Charles Brown of Pontiac Central was the only record breaker of the meet as he heaved a shot 54½ feet, topping the old record of 53 feet set by Jim Childs of River Rouge in 1956.

Rounding out the top ten team places were Ypsilanti, fifth with 18, Muskegon Heights 12; Lincoln Park 10; Grosse Pointe 9½; Saginaw 9, and Lansing Eastern, 8.

Michigan Runners Win at Abilene

Abilene, Tex. — UPI — The University of Michigan, running outdoors for the first time this year, captured seven first places and established a pair of stadium records to win a quadrangular track and field meet here Saturday over Abilene Christian College, the University of Texas and Ohio State.

The Wolverines scored 61 points, ACC 51½, Texas 39 and Ohio State 22½.
