

Trojans Score 9 Points To Tie for 8th Place

Baidy Over 12-9 1/2

ANN ARBOR — John W. Baidy added his name to a long succession of great high school pole vaulters representing Monroe's Trojans here Saturday when he cleared the bar at 12 feet 9 1/2 inches to tie with Mickey Turckek of Taylor Center for first place in the state class A track and field finals on Ferry Field.

The height is a new Monroe High School record, eclipsing the mark of 12-8 set by Colton Jones who last year bettered a school record which had stood since 1942 when Forrest Naveaux set the state class A record of 12 feet 7 1/2 inches. The first Michigan prep vaulters to go over the 12 foot mark were from Monroe.

Baidy also cleared the bar at 8 feet 1 inch in the high school 6 and a two-way tie for third place with Pontiac Central's Bill Lee.

Baidy thus accounted for a total of 9 points to tie the Trojans with Lansing Sexton and Ypsilanti Central for 8th place in the final standings. Bill Marshall, the only other Trojan qualifier for the state meet, failed to place in

the 440 yard dash although running good time.

The pole vault event started at 10:30 a.m. and Baidy made his last run at 3:30 p.m. During the 7 hours of competition he started and finished the high jump event.

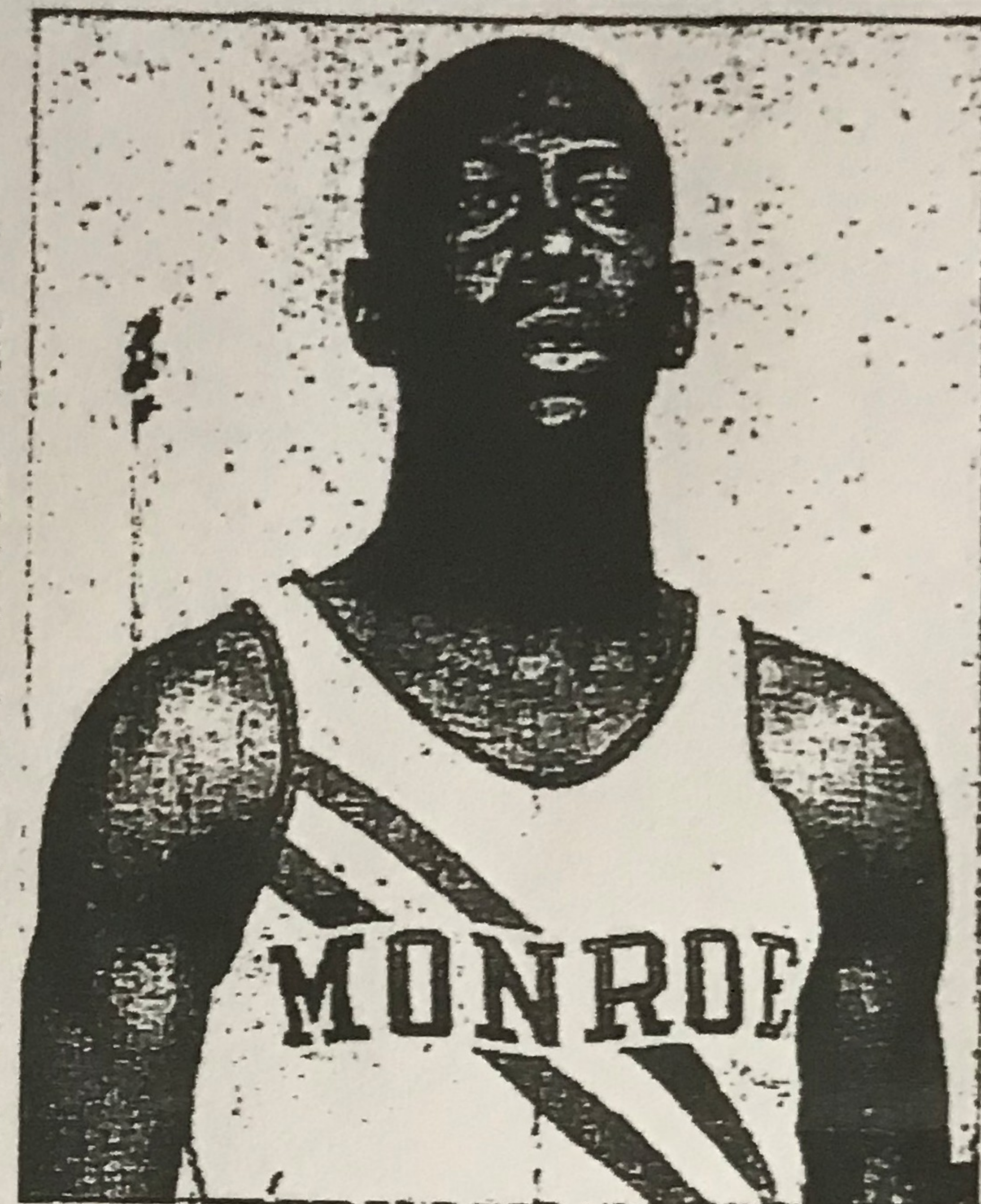
Baidy was getting his steps perfectly in the pole vault as he battled with the Taylor Center vaulter who cleared 12 feet to win the event at the Dick Waters Relays in Monroe May 27 when Baidy was not competing. Both vaulters missed twice at the winning height. Then Turckek wiggled over and Baidy made it. The official measurement was taken with Trojan Coach Kerry Keating on hand and the height was set at 12 feet 9 1/2 inches.

The bar was raised to 13 feet as the standards. The Taylor Center vaulter couldn't come close while

Baidy narrowly missed the height on two of his three trials.

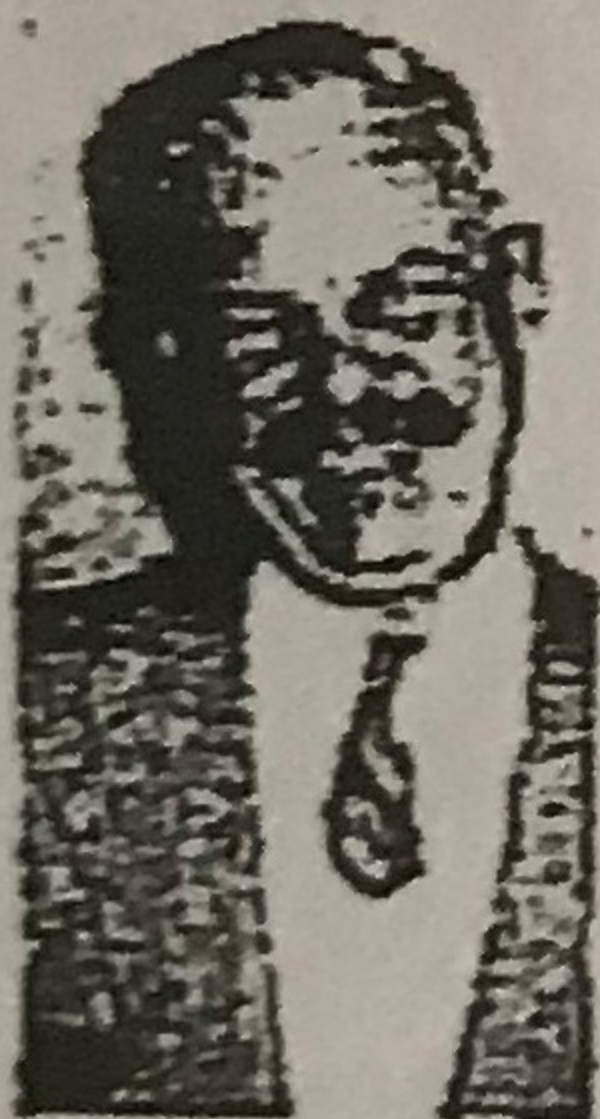
He'll get another chance. Coach Keating has accepted an invitation for Baidy to compete in the 6th annual Champions of Champions meet at Kalamazoo College June 3 in the meet of state prep champions sponsored by the Kalamazoo Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Pontiac Central took the class A championship with 44 points to Flint Northern's 41 with Birmingham led by Steve Jacobson's 21 3/4 broad jump and records to Northern's Maurice Pate in both sprints, taking third with 12. Dearborn was next with 15 followed by Ann Arbor 15 1/2, Saginaw Arthur Hill 13, Inkster Roosevelt 10 and Monroe, Lansing Sexton and Ypsilanti with 9 each.
