Pontiac Central Takes Class A Track Honors

ANN ARBOR — Pontiac Central, led by its powerful shotput trio and the hurdling of Leon Prentis, nosed out Flint Northern in the next to last event of the meet to win the State Class A track title yesterday.

Shotputters Bredell Pritchett, Jerry Hush, both of whom smashed the old state record of 57 feet, combined with teammate Charlie Brown for 14 points to propel Pontiac to its fifth state crown in the past six years.

Edges Northern Pontiac finished with 44 points and edged Flint Northern by three and offset a brilliant one-man show by Northern's Maurice Pea.

Birmingham finished third with 19, followed in order by Dearborn with 16, Ann Arbor 15½, Saginaw Arthur Hill 15, Inkster Roosevelt 10, and Lansing Sexton, Monroe and Ypsilanti, 9 each.

Twenty-four other teams were bunched further behind.

Pritchett heaved the shot 59 feet, 5¼ inches, smashing the old state mark of 57 feet set in 1954 by Muskegon's Joel Boyden. Teammate Rush also broke the mark with a heave of 57-7 for second place.

Prentis captured the 110 high hurdles and finished second in the 180-yard lows to account for 11 of Pontiac's total points.

Pea, Flint Northern's great sprinter, won the 220-yard dash, breaking a 35-year-old state record, and tied the state mark for the 100-yard dash. He also anchored Flint Northern's winning effort in the 880-yard relay.

His time of 21.3 in the 220 was four-tenths of a second under the previous record set in 1925 by George Hester of Detroit Northern and tied in 1953 by Pontiac's Alonzo Harris. His 9.9 clocking in the 110-yard dash marked the third time the state record set in 1925 by Hester was equaled.

The only other record to fall in the meet which attracted 422 athletes from 85 schools was in the high jump. Dearborn's Al Ammerman leaped 6-foot 4½ inches to break the previous mark of 6-4 set by Milton Mead of Bay City Central in 1950.

Despite its strong performances in the hurdles and shotput, Pontiac actually gained its margin of victory when Bill Lee garnered a third place in the high jump, the next to last event of the day.

Steve Jacobson of Birmingham, who finished second to Pea in both dashes, came back to win the broad jump with a leap of 23-feet 7½ inches to almost singlehandedly give his team third place in the meet. Joe Mason of Saginaw Arthur Hill won the 180-yard low hurdles, edging out Pontiac's Prentis by scant inches at the tape. Mason's time of 19 seconds flat tied the state record but was disallowed because of a strong tail wind.

The best performances by Battle Creek Central athletes was a second place in one of the 440-yard dash heats by Joe Bass and a tie for fourth place in the pole vault by John Best.
