Fenton Cops Third Place

Sherman Fulfills Dream

Grand Rapids—Durand's Bob Sherman made a four-year dream come true Saturday despite second-place finishes in the 120 and 180-yard high and low hurdles in the Class B State track meet here.

Since he was a freshman, the four-sport star has aimed at the State meet high hurdle record of 14.9 seconds set by Dave Hill of Ypsilanti in 1949. Saturday was Sherman's day. In the preliminaries he skimmed over the tall timber in 14.5.

However, the Durand speedster, who had previously won 17 of 18 tries this season, met his match in Charles Gray of Ecorse. Gray not only defeated Sherman in both the highs and lows, but he also tied Sherman's long sought after record which stood untrampled only four hours.

In the highs, Sherman and Gray raced neck and neck until the final hurdle when Sherman hooked the top of the obstacle, sent it tumbling and stumbled across the line three steps behind Gray.

Ecorse dominated the field with 17 entries and copped the team honors with 48 3/11 points, beating Cranbrook of Bloomfield Hills with a first in the 880-yard relay, the final event. Cranbrook placed second in the 880 and wound up with 46 6/11.

Flint-area schools rounded out the top five as Fenton accumulated 17 3/11, Durand 15 17/22 and Bendle 12 1/2.

Fenton's Jack Paterson ran his win streak to 12 by copping the shot put with 53.2. It was his longest toss of the season.

Bendle's Paul Krause was the County's individual star. He tied Durand's Mike Wells for first place in the pole vault at 12-1, leaped 5-11 for fourth place in the high jump and placed third in the high hurdles with 15-3 for all of Bendle's points.

Kearsley's medley relay team of Martin Crane, Dale Krittzman, John Williams and Marv Owen sprinted home in 2:35.8 while Davison's crew of Brian Campbell, Dave Roat, George Gotgesell and Ralph Palmer finished fourth in 2:37.2. Kearsley's 880 team, composed of the same quartet, tied for sixth with Grand Rapids Godwin with a time of 1:37.6.

Fenton's 880 squad of Harold Huff, Bill Hajec, Dale Van-Avery and Bryan Gould turned in a fine showing placing third behind Ecorse and Cranbrook in 1:36.5.

Fenton's other points were scored by Hajec with a third in the 220 and fifth in the 100-yard dashes and Bob Bruder's 11-way tie for fifth in the high jump and sixth in the low hurdles.

Dave Hildebidle picked up

Mandeville's only point with a third in the first section of the 440 while Swartz Creek's Walt Henry, Dort Field Regional winner, shared in the 11 way tie for fifth in the high jump. Mike Wells of Durand also was in on the high jump jumble for fifth.

Ecorse's Jerry Holmes set the only other record by clearing 6:2 1/2 in the high jump. Holmes had to ward off the efforts of Bill Chmielewski, the 6-10 all-State basketball star from Detroit Holy Redeemer. Chmielewski went out at 6:0 with Charles Jackson of Willow Run.

On Holmes' first attempt at the 6-2 record held by Bill Dale of Wayne since 1942, he cleared

the bar with plenty to spare. When the official measure was made, it showed he had gone 6:2 1/2 and became the State Meet record holder. He failed to make 6-3 1/2 in three tries.

Jim Born of Dowagiac suffered an unfortunate accident on the turn of the 220-yard dash. As he made the turn, the judge on the turn stepped onto the track and bumped Born. Despite breaking his stride and

losing several yards, he finished sixth.

In the 100-yard dash, Cranbrook's Larry DeWitt pulled up 20-yards short thinking he had crossed the line, the winner. He wound up third, two-tenths of a second behind winner Craig LaGrone who was clocked in 10.2.
