Shot Putters Boost Eastern in Track Duel With Mumford

Coach Stan Mullin believes his Mumford track team stands a good chance of retaining the Public School League championship next week but at the moment he's more concerned with the outcome of the East Side meet at Mumford tomorrow.

"It looks like Eastern's power in the shot put will be too much for us to overcome in the East Side meet," Mullin said when

the sectional trials were completed.

Eastern weightmen placed 1-2-3-5 in the preliminaries and would score 26 points by retaining the same positions in the finals. Mumford did not qualify in the event. Perry Mun led Eastern with a toss of 47 feet 1 1/4 inches, with Louis Proctor not far behind at 46-11 1/4. Jerry Beckham was third and Reg Harding fifth.

Points count on a basis of 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Eliminations were held in all events except the half mile and sprint relays. Mumford gained 18 qualifiers to Eastern's 16. Northern had 11, followed by Central and Pershing 6 each; Denby 5; Northeastern 4; Southeastern and Cass 3 each.

Ken Burnley, of Mumford, ran the 220-yard dash around a curve in :21.8, tying a league record set by Jerry Green, of Miller, in 1955. He also was caught in :09.8, a tenth of a second slower than the record for the 100-yard dash.

Mile ace Frank Carissimi, of Denby, finished 200 yards in front of teammate Jim Carlson in 4:24.2. His time was only six-tenths of a second slower than the league record of 4:23.6.
