Harry Seymour, Ecorse High quartermiler, traveled light Saturday—about two ounces too light.

Seymour, a speedy senior, ran the opening leg on the Raiders' sprint medley relay team Saturday at the University of Detroit Relays.

Harry led the field home all right but made one costly mistake. He forgot to take a baton along.

WHEN HE reached the finish line and discovered he had no baton, he "touched off" to the second runner. His teammates followed through, won the race, but had to be disqualified. Cranbrook was declared winner of the event.

As things turned out the six points Ecorse lost in the disqualification cost the Raiders the meet and their Class B title. Cranbrook won, 43-43.

Class A honors went to Redford, which dethroned Pontiac Central, 33-32. The Huskies won only two events, the two-mile and four-mile relays, but scored in 11 of the 12 events.

Redford's time of 8:13.9 in the two-mile relay accounted for one of seven records set on a cold, windy and dull day.

A Cranbrook foursome of Barney Crouse, Dave Frey, Tom Zavelson and Larry DeWitt won the half-mile by a stride. It was a head-to-head battle the full distance.

FRANK CARESSIMI, Danby's fine miler, turned in an unofficial clocking of 4:23 in anchoring his school's distance medley relay team.

One of the day's disappointments developed in the Class A mile relay where Northwestern's Henry Carr, who has been clocked in 48.3 in the 440 this season, came limping home with a pulled tendon and may be sidelined indefinitely.
