

CARR: What Now for Ace?

Continued From 1st Spts. Page gains the necessary experience.

Carr's biggest booster is his track coach, Tom Hendricks. "Henry is the greatest runner ever to hit this town," he said. "He's a great runner with an even greater temperament."

Hendricks used Carr in the 440 four times this season in duel meets and in one outing he skirled along at a 47.6 pace. The coach indicated at the time he might send Carr to the Olympic preliminaries to run in the 400 meters.

Almost overlooked in Carr's record - shattering performance was the fact he led the qualifiers in the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches.

Hendricks expects Carr to break the Metro record of 23 feet $\frac{3}{4}$ inches in this event as well.

Redford, the defending west side champion, and North-

western are expected to make a run for the title tomorrow. Northwestern led the preliminaries with 14 qualifiers while Redford, scoring heavily in the distance events, will send 12 to the title round.

NORTHWESTERN'S sensational shot putter, Fred Hatcher, walloped the Metro mark of 53 feet 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in the event with a tremendous heave of 57 feet 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches. He followed with a toss of 55-1 $\frac{1}{2}$, but both tosses were disallowed because his ball shot was four ounces under the regulation 12-pound weight. He did manage to lead the qualifiers, though, when he used the 12-pounder for a 51-7 put.

The east side championships will be held today at Mumford with the host school and Eastern figured to battle down to the wire for the title.
