

DETROIT — Tom Robinson, of Nassau, Bahamas, who won the British Empire 200-yard title in '58 and who has since won six individual Big Ten championships, will captain the University of Michigan track team for the '61 season.

Women golfers from throughout the midwest are expected to gather at the University of Michigan golf course, June 27-July 1, for the area's first national golf school for Women. The school will be held under the joint sponsorship of the Ladies P.G.A. and the University's women's physical education department.

Despite a gate setback on its initial program a month ago, the Metropolitan Boxing Club plans to continue promoting ring cards at the Graystone Ballroom on a monthly basis. James Jackson, chairman of the Metropolitan group, announced Saturday "we definitely will continue operations for the next six months."

The next Graystone card is slated for Thursday night, June 16, and pairs Chuck Taylor and Tommy Johnson in the 10-round lightweight main event. Taylor has scored 28 victories in 40 starts, including decisions over Eli Leggett and Carmine Price. He fought a draw with Charley Smith. Johnson, a one-time stablemate of Muskegon's Kenny Lane, has won 10 of 11 bouts. His only loss was a split decision to LeRoy Jeffery.

The signing of Willie (The Bird) Jones, a Northwestern University star, to a National Basketball Assn. contract was announced Saturday by the Detroit Pistons. Jones, who stands 6-foot-8 and weighs 180 pounds, was Detroit's fifth choice in the NBA's draft of college players last March. He is 24.

HENRY CARR, Northwestern High's all-round athlete, turned in one of the most amazing performances ever seen in the state Wednesday. He placed first in the broad jump with one leap and bettered recognized Michigan records in the 100 and 220-yard dashes. His marks of 9.6 seconds

in the 100 and 20.8 in the 220 will not be accepted officially as state records, however. These must be set in state meets and the Public School League does not complete in such events.

It was Northwestern Coach Tom Hendrick who suggested that Carr take only one leap in the broad jump and save himself for the trials in the 100 and 220-yard dashes on the Redford High Track. Henry cleared 22 feet  $\frac{3}{4}$  inches for a 10-inch advantage over Dennis Holland, of Cody.

In other record-shattering efforts Sam Davison, of Northern, won the East Side 180-yard low hurdles in :19.7 to tie the record set last year by Felton Rogers, of Eastern, and Lonnie Sanders, of Pershing. Fred Hatcher, of Northwestern, put the shot 65 feet  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches.

In the Compton, California Invitational track meet Don Styron won the 220-yard low hurdles in :22.2, the 400-meter hurdles in :51.5, and placed third behind Lee Calhoun and Hayes Jones in the 110-meters highs. Calhoun did :13.5 Jones, of Eastern Michigan, ran :13.9.

Lowell Perry, 28, former University of Michigan football star who later played for the Pittsburgh Steelers, has been hired as Federal Judge Frank A. Picard's law clerk. Judge Picard has been an avid U. of M. football fan since his own days as an university student.

The new law clerk, will graduate from the Detroit Law College this month. Perry, his wife, Maxine, a Western High School teacher, and their son, Lowell Jr., 4, live at 1677 Virginia Park.

HENRY HANK, former Miller High Golden Glove champion now fifth-ranked among the nation's middleweights, has been signed for a 10-round outdoor match highlighting the city's annual International Freedom Festival. The program will be held in U-D Stadium June 28, only the fourth outdoor show in the city since World War II and the first since 1951.

Hank, currently under a temporary suspension ordered by the Louisiana State Athletic Commission, will meet Victor Zalazar,
