

**Rex Cawley
Is Back---
Who-o-s-h!**

Rex Cawley made a triumphant return to Michigan Wednesday.

The Farmington speedster, who went to the University of Southern California last fall because of its fine track weather, stepped off a brilliant 46.1 in winning the 440-yard run at Thurston High School over a rain-soaked track that hasn't been worked on in two weeks.

CAWLEY'S time was only six-tenths of a second off the winning pace in the Big Ten outdoor meet last month. Cawley hopes to make the United States Olympic team in the 400-meter hurdles. He won the high hurdles at Thurston in 14.6 seconds.

The first of a series of weekly track meets tagged the Olympic Development AAU meet drew a bevy of local college and prep stars.

Denby's Frank Carissimi turned to the half-mile since there wasn't a mile run, and turned in a 1:58—better than the time that won the City League meet last week.

Three state prep champions won their events—Pontiac Central's Bredell Pritchett with a 47-9¾ heave of the 16-pound shot, Birmingham's Steve Jacobson with a 22-3¼ leap in the broad jump and Lutheran West's Craig LaGrone with 10 seconds flat for the 16-year-old-and-under 100-yard dash.
