DETROIT—On the baked cinder track of Redford High Thursday, Henry Carr equaled the national schoolboy record of :20.6 in the 220; Fred Hatcher threw the shot 58 feet 8 inches and Northwestern's half-mile relay team stepped a lively 1:28.2.

With Henry Carr as its No. 1 rocket, Northwestern took home its first track championship since 1949 by edging a fire-up Mumford team, 94-87, in a two-school race. Henry also won the 100 in :09.9 and the broad jump in 23-1½ which didn't come up to his :09.6 century or :20:8 22 last week.

The 6-3 Northwestern junior didn't seem impressed that he had equaled Mel Clipper's national high school mark when the Southern Cal. sophomore was a senior at Muir High in Pasadena. Carr came back later to anchor the half-mile relay quartet with Bobby Harris, Troy Allen and Talt Malone to a record 1:28.2.

Hatcher's heave of 58 feet 8 inches was his best ever and accounted for one of six first places Northwestern earned over a tense afternoon. Northern's Sam Davidson whizzed over the 180-yard low hurdles in :19.3.
