

# Runs 21.4 Race At Kazoo; Hits 9.8 in Century

KALAMAZOO — "Mack the Knife Is Back in Town," as the song goes, and maybe it isn't too late.

Mack Hunter of Muskegon Heights, Greater Muskegon's best-ever sprinter who had to forego competition in the state track meet because of an ankle injury, flashed to victory in the 100- and 220-yard dashes in the Kalamazoo Jaycees' Champion of Champions track meet at Angell Field here Friday night.

The Tigers speedster's only disappointment was that Flint Northern's Maurice Pea, state class A 100- and 220-yard dash champion, did not compete in the Kalamazoo meet.

Hunter left little doubt in anyone's mind that he is fully recovered by setting a new Greater Muskegon record with a 21.4-second clocking in the furlong and being named outstanding individual in the meet. He ran the 100 in 9.8 seconds and anchored the Heights 880-yard relay team to a second place.

The Tiger foursome was last in the five-team field when Hunter took the baton and he overtook everyone but Flint Southwestern's anchor man. The Flint team was clocked in 1:31.9 while the Tigers had 1:32.4. Sam McMurray, Ed Jackson and Joe Parham also ran for the Heights.

Hunter's next stop will be the Tri-State AAU meet at Fort Wayne, Ind., next week end, where he will compete at Olympic distances for the first time.

Tiger track coach Rudy Thies said that if Hunter can run the 100 meters in 10.5 seconds he may get a chance to compete in the National AAU meet at Bakersfield, Calif., later this month.

The 100 meters will be run at Fort Wayne Friday night with the 200 meters on Saturday night.

Hunter's 21.4 in the 220 Friday night erased the old Greater Muskegon mark of 21.5 set by Tom O'Neil of the Heights in 1958 and tied by Hunter earlier this season.

Other area athletes did well in Friday's meet. Bill Swingle of Grand Haven won the shot put with a heave of 57 feet, 4 inches, for a new Grand Haven High record. Jackson of the Heights was second in the 120-yard high hurdles; Parham of the Heights was third in the 100; Sam Moore of Muskegon was fourth in the broad jump; and Muskegon Catholic Central's medley relay team was second to Flint Southwestern which won the event in 2:28.8.
