

NW Too Much In Metro Track

Northwestern High has everything just about wrapped up and tomorrow's running of the Metro track finals at Redford appear to be merely a formality.

The Colts possess one of the most potent aggregations to go into the final round in several years, especially in the sprints where they seem to be able to score at will.

The slim gathering that turned out to watch yesterday's preliminaries witnessed an awesome display of first-place power by Northwestern.

THE COLTS paced the qualifiers in five different events, tied with Mumford in the Medley Relay at two minutes, 29 seconds flat, and shattered the half-mile relay standard with a fancy 1:28.3.

Naturally, Henry Carr led the Colts. Carr topped the qualifiers in three events — the 100 and 220-yard dashes and the broad jump.

Carr led the field in the broad jump with 23 feet, 1½ inches, only ¾ inches shy of the record he set last week in the west side championships.

Then Carr came back to set the pace in the 100 with 9.9 and a 20.7 time in the 220-yard. The 220 time was actually one-tenth second faster than the 20.8 record he set last week, but the mark was disallowed because of a five-mile per-hour tailwind.

IT WAS ONE of two record times which will go unrecognized because of the wind. Earlier, Sam Davidson of Northern broke the mark in the 180-yard low hurdles in 19.3 seconds, the old record was 19.7.

Carr wasn't done for the day. He ran the third 220-yard leg of the record-setting half-mile relay team. He took the baton in the passing zone with a five-yard lead and by the time he handed the stick off to anchor-man Troy Allen, he had extended the Northwestern lead to practically 25 yards. He was timed in an amazing 20.5 seconds for his lap.

All in all, Northwestern will send 11 individual qualifiers and two relay teams into the finals. Mumford actually led the individual qualifiers with 12, but the Mustangs appear to have to be satisfied with second place.
