

TOP TRACK QUALIFIERS

Carissimi and Carr Below Par--but Win

BY HAL SCHRAM Northwestern High, pointing track title since 1949, squeezed 11 individual qualifiers and two relay teams out of Tuesday's qualifying heats at Redford High.

Coach Tom Hendricks and his Colts didn't overwhelm the field numerically but from a performance standpoint it was a one-school show.

Northwestern will have qualifiers in eight of the 13 events Thursday when survivors again converge at Redford. Field events start at 2 p.m. and track events at 3:30 p.m.

WITH HENRY CARR, the city's top swifty, showing the way, the Colts posted the best qualifying performance in six events and accounted for the day's only record when their 880-yard relay team of Carr, Talt Malone, Bob Harris and Troy Allen turned in a sizzling 1:28.3 performance.

Although he "didn't feel just right" and wasn't shooting for any of the three records he already owns, Carr led the qualifying in the 100 (.09.9), 220 (.20.7) and broad jump (23-1 1/2).

His 20.7 in the 220 was one-tenth of a second better than his own league record but was disallowed due to a favoring tailwind.

Nor did Denby's Frank Carissimi perform in expected fashion. The celebrated East Side miler, who ripped off a 4:18 record effort last week, tailed off to 4:33.1 Tuesday.

"Don't ask me why he didn't do better," said Coach Ralph Green. "I guess he just didn't feel like running."

BILL STEWART of Redford was one fellow who didn't let the fine crowd down. Stewart turned in a blistering 1:58.1 half-mile, by far the best individual effort of the afternoon.

While no one is conceding Northwestern the champion-

ship, it is evident that the Colts will win with their overwhelming dash and relay power.

Hendricks also has the league's top shotputter in Fred Hatcher, a burly football lineman who qualified
