

# Muddy Turf Kills Records

Although there were no records set, tournament officials unanimously agreed that the Lincoln Park J. C. track meet at Lincoln Park High School yesterday evening was a success.

Almost 500 people attended the festivities which featured some of the top collegiate and prep names in Michigan track circles.

A MUDDY TURF assured no AAU marks would be threatened, but lack of record performances failed to dampen the crowd's enthusiasm.

In the feature events, Jim Mosely nipped Ken Burnley of Mumford and John Telford of the Detroit track club to take the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds.

Telford, ex-Wayne State star, led all the way to claim the 440-yard run in 48.3 seconds with Frank Carissimi, who broke the Metropolitan League mile mark for Denby the past season, edging Jerry Bocci of Western Michigan in the Invitational mile with a 4:31 time.

Bocci won the two mile event in 9:51 with Redford High's fine runner, Terry Moore, and Bob Burger, Lincoln Park track club, finishing second and third, respectively.

Mauri Jormakka of Finland, attending Eastern Michigan University, came in first in the 3,000-meter steeplechase in 9:28 followed by Jerry Bashaw, LP track club, and Henry Kennedy, ex-cross country ace from Michigan State.

JIM BRODIE of the Detroit Police Department went over the bar at 5 feet 8 inches to win the high jump.

In the junior division, Willard Reinstein's 4:53 gave him the mile title with Dennis McGee doing 15.2 to lead in the 120-yard high hurdles.

In a special women's event, Lillie Johnson was the judges' choice in the 100-yard dash in an eyelash finish with her sister, Rita.
