# Northern Is Runner-Up In Sixth Huron Relays

YPSILANTI — Flint Northern High thinclads finished second Saturday behind Mansfield, Ohio, in the Class A division of the sixth annual Huron Relays at Eastern Michigan University.

Flint Southwestern was sixth and Flint Central tied with Lansing Sexton for eighth in the 39-team event.

Northern's winning mile relay team of Ed Johnson, Charles Moore, Willie Dent and Hullett Edwards set a record for that

event with a 3:38 clocking to bust the old mark by two-tenths of a second.

The Vikings (Dennis McGee, Dalton Kimble, Johnson and Edwards) also finished first in the 880-yard relay in 1:34.5. Southwestern was third.

Flint Central won the two-mile relay in 8:34.3 with Malcolm Alexander, John Shaw, Boysie Mathis and Bob Deheen doing the running.

Pontiac Central's Bradel Pritchett set a relays shot put record of 55-9 to place ahead of that event.

Willie Dent of Northern and Jim Bracy of Southwestern finished 2-3 in the broad jump. Northern's Dennis McGee third in the 60-yard dash and Southwestern's Floyd Bates third in the 65-yard low hurdles.

The Mansfield crew rolled up 33 1/4 points, mostly on the efforts of Henry Weaver, who won three individual titles.

Birmingham was defending champion.

Weaver stole the show in the individual events as he won the broad jump with a leap of 21 feet, 3 1/2 inches, the 60-yard dash in 6.3 seconds, and the 65-yard low hurdles in 7.8. Weaver's time in the dash tied the relays record set by Bob Manning of Pontiac in 1959.

Mansfield also won the sprint medley relay as W. B. Jefferson, Tom Town, John Brooks, and Rick Ott combined for the victory.

Mansfield teams also placed third in the two-mile relay and fifth in the 880-yard relay.

## Inexperience Doesn't Stop Flint Jumpers

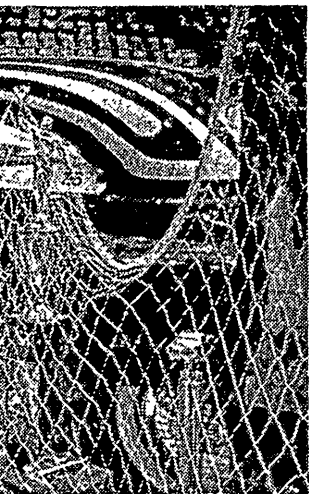
