

**Carissimi
Faster Yet
In Mile**

Michigan's fastest high school miler keeps getting faster and faster.

Frank Carissimi, 135-pound Denby senior, whirled and whirled around Mumford's track Wednesday to break his own mile record by three-tenths of a second. Carissimi lowered his week-old record of 4:28 to 4:27.7.

Last week Carissimi beat Jan Bowen's state mark of 4:31.1. Bowen, of Alma High, set the mark at the recent Ypsilanti Relays.

BUT MUMFORD outclassed Denby in the other events to win their dual meet, 70½-17½. Ken Burnley won the 220-yard dash and the 25-yard dash and anchored the 880-yard winning relay team for Mumford.

Mumford, the City League defending champion, won nine events and tied another as it took its second meet of the season.

Charles Hines, who starred as a halfback for Southwestern, was just as flashy as a runner as he led the Prospectors to a 60½-30½ victory over Redford. Hines won the high and low hurdles, the pole vault and anchored Southwestern's winning relay team.

COOLEY TOOK nine of 11 first places and swept the mile, pole vault and low hurdles to wallop Chadsey, 75-16.

Bill Quinn got half the Chadsey points by winning the 220-yard run and tying for first in the high jump.

Henry Carr placed first in the 30-yard dash and the 440 and ran a leg on the winning 880-yard relay team in leading Northwestern to a 71½-19½ victory over Western.

The Colts' Art Norman tied the City League 30-yard low hurdles indoor record of four seconds.

Lake Shore Romps

Lake Shore High School captured 10 of 12 first places and tied for another in whipping Lakeview, 82-27, Wednesday in a dual track meet. Richard DeCook took the shotput and broad jump and Wayman Swint won the sprints for Lake Shore.
