Henry Carr, Northwestern's 18year-old senior, who cracked
three Public School League marks
last year, started the session with
a new one Thursday. Three
timers caught Carr in 51.5
seconds for the 440-year run as
Northwestern whipped Mackenzie,
56-34, in an indoor meet at Mackenzie. The time surpassed the
indoor record of 53-4 set by
Ulysses Amos, another Northwestern sprinter, in 1936.

"It's fantastic, it really is, as Carr isn't in shape yet and there's no telling what he'll do then. I just hope he stays healthy," said Coash Tom Hendricks. "He really went and I predict Henry will run the quarter in 46 seconds before the season is over."

Hendricks said the Northwestern star ran the 100 in 09.6, the 220 in 20.6; and broad jumped 23-4 for Public School League records last year.

Stan Hills scored 16¼ points while leading Western to a 58-33 victory over Cody. He won the 25-year dash, high and low hurdles besides anchoring the half-mile relay.
