Forsythe Says No Drastic Changes

LANSING (UPI)—The Michigan
High School Athletic Association
will receive Detroit public high
schools in statewide play with
open arms, State Athletic Director Charles Forsythe said today.

"We're very pleased that the of Detroit Board of Education plans of to return to state competition," He Forsythe said. "It's a good thing for outstate boys to compete with Detroit boys."

The Detroit board voted Tues-G day night to enter state competition in six sports, ending 31 years of absence from the statewide prep sports scene.

Forsythe said any question Waraised about authenticity of state champions will be answered with the Detroit board's action.

Detroit public school trackmen and swimmers will benefit especially from the action, Forsythe said, because any records they set previously were not included in state prep record books.
