Track Trick: 106¹/₂-2¹/₂

Eastern High went over to Belle Isle Thursday to run up a fantastic track victory. Coach Lorenzo Wright and his Indians crushed Southeastern, 106¹/₂-2¹/₂.

However, this is not a record. Back in the late '40s Southeastern, no less, slammed every event—all 13 of them—to blank old Miller High, 109-0.

Thursday's meeting, according to Wright, "was pretty awful."

"We won all three places in the 100, for distance, and the winner was clocked in 10.8!"

Southeastern got its first 2¹/₂ points on Ron Moore's third in the 220, a third by Arcos Brooks in the 440, and a tie for third by Don Broner in the high jump. . . .

WHILE THE Jungaleers went to Belle Isle to get bombed, Northwestern and Chadsey went to Southeastern's ill-kept track for their dual meet.

On a track which hadn't seen a rake or roller in days, talented Henry Carr again wrote his name in the City League record book.

Coach Tom Hendricks sent his speedster to the line in the 440 and Carr responded with a flashy :47.8 quarter-mile, carving a full second off the old conference record.
