Waterford's Mike Kation turned in a 4:23.4 mile. Steve Meyer of Berkeley was caught in .48.8 in the 440. Brendell Pritchett of Pontiac Central threw the shot 56 feet nine inches.

JIM YOGLER of Lutheran West slipped over the 150-yard low hurdles in :19.2 seconds, eight tenths of a second under the state Class B record. Paul Rakow tossed the shot 52 feet 5 1/2 inches for Lutheran West.

Barney Krause of Cranbrook jumped and anchored the Crosses.
