



# Linden Girls Earn Title

Sue Fowler, Margaret Haley and Rena Carnes had two things in common Monday at the first Suburban Class C League girls' track meet at Dye. They were all double winners and they are from Linden.

Linden also won the 200-yard relay in accumulating 61 points to walk off with the meet. Second place Utley scored 26½, followed by Goodrich 20½ and Dye 20.

The boys' meet is slated for Wednesday at the same site starting at 6:30 p.m.

Miss Fowler won the 70-yard low hurdles in 11.1 seconds and high jumped 4'2½. Miss Haley captured the 75-yard dash in 9.1 and went 7.3 in the standing broad jump. Miss Carnes dominated the throwing events with a softball toss of 19½ and shot put mark of 31.3½.

Utley won the only other two events. Triplets Lela, Lucretia and Emma Leonard paced the 440 relay team and Emma won the running broad jump with a leap of 13.7½.

Linden's biggest triumph was in the standing broad jump where Pat Hogan and Renee Jones followed Miss Haley to give the Eagles 12 points. Points were awarded for first through fifth place finishes.

Linden had nine points in the low hurdles with Miss Hogan second to Miss Fowler and it got eight in the 75 with Grace Combs third and Miss Haley's first.

The best performance any other team could give was Dye's six points in the 75 and Goodrich's six in the running broad jump.

All winning times became records since this is the first year the Suburban League has been in competition.

# Flint Runners Capture 10 Firsts in Valley Relays

SAGINAW — Flint Central, Northern and Southwestern High captured 10 first places, but Saginaw High earned the team championship in the third Arthur Hill Relays held here Monday night.

Central won five events, Southwestern three and Northern two in a four-team struggle which wasn't decided until the last two events.

Saginaw totaled 54 points to dethrone two-time champion Northern which placed third Monday with 51½. Central was second with 52½ and Southwestern fourth with 49½. Then came Arthur Hill 32, Midland 28 and Bay City Central 21½.

Despite intermittent sprinkles, the track was fast and records tumbled in nine of the 14 events. The Flint schools were responsible for six records.

ALL EVENTS were conducted on a team basis with three-man totals deciding the broad jump, high jump and pole vault and a four-man total deciding the shot put.

The team title was decided in the shot putters' relay where Northern and Southwestern were disqualified for running out of their lanes. Up to that point the Vikings and Colts shared the lead by one point over Central and 2½ over Saginaw. The disqualifications enabled Saginaw to pick up six points for the lead and its

points when its shuttle high hurdles team was disqualified.

The Trojans accounted for the four victories which evaded the Flint schools.

Central wiped out meet records in the broad jump, shot put, two-mile and distance medley relays. Northern cracked the middle distance mark, Southwestern shattered the sprint medley standard and Saginaw created records in the shot putters relay, pole vault and high jump.

FLOYD BATES and Hamp Morris, who ran the first and second legs on Southwestern's shuttle hurdles teams, were the only Flint contestants to figure in two first places. Bates also helped the 880 team finish third and the high jump team to take fourth. Morris also was a member of the high jump team.

Southwestern's Chester Harris contributed a spirited kick to win the sprint medley with an unofficial 49.6 for the final 440-yard leg. Another excellent unofficial time was John Shaw's unofficial 1:57.6 anchor 880 leg to win the two-mile relay for Central.

Both kicks enabled their teams to establish meet records.

Monday's meet was the final tuneup for the state championship meet Saturday at East Lansing.
