

RECORD RUNNING—Henry Carr, an 18-year-old Detroit schoolboy, yesterday equalled the world record time of 20 seconds flat in the 220-yard dash on a wind-whipped track.

There were no wind gauges at the track, but winds were estimated at 14 miles per hour. The strength of the wind probably will prevent Carr from receiving official recognition. His coach, Tom Hendricks of Detroit Northwestern High, said he doubts if he'll even apply for recognition.

The world record is held by Dave Sime of Duke, a 1960 Olympic sprint standout. Sime set the mark in 1956 at Sanger, Calif.

Carr also was clocked at :09.4 for the 100 dash—equalling Jesse Owens' national scholastic record for the second time—in the dual meet.
