SALINE—Officials of the Saline Dual-Meet Track Conference are going to have to purchase two more trophies.

Last night the loop completed its slate with three teams deadlocked for the lead—Pinckney, Saline and Chelsea. Chelsea snarled things by upsetting Saline, 58²/₂-50¹/₂, after Pinckney had surprised the Bulldogs last week.

In other matches last night, Pinckney romped past Dexter, 80¹/₂-28¹/₂, for the biggest total of the season and Manchester registered its first triumph of the campaign, beating Ypsilanti Roosevelt, 57-51.

Chelsea winners were Dave McLaughlin (100 and 220-yard dashes and shot put), Jim Maynard (high and low hurdles), Don Sexton (broad jump and 440) and the 880-yard relay team of Larry Cattell, Sexton, Warren Porath and McLaughlin. Saline winners were Ken Volz (880), Bob Yuhasz (mile), Lyle Wahl (pole vault), Dave Hoeft (high jump) and the mile relay unit of Dave Detting, Volz, Mike Johnson and Ed Strait.

Pinckney's firsts included Bob Beck (high and low hurdles), Jim Wicker (100 and 220), Gerald Pike (880), Roy Kinsey (mile), John Schroeder (broad jump) and the relay teams of Beck, John Holben, Tim Clark and Wicker (880) and Roy Carpenter, John Colone, Kinsey and Pike (mile). Ed Guy tied Dexter's Cliff Blossom in the high jump and the other Dexter first placers were Blossom in the pole vault and Norm Bell in the 440.

Ken Brokaw won three events and Bill Ousley two to lead Manchester to its initial victory. Brokaw won the 100, pole vault and shot put. Bill Ousley won the hurdles events, Bud Cox the 440. Ron Mann the broad jump and Dwight Eisenhauer, Ousley, Brokaw and Mann the 880-yard relay. Winning for Roosevelt were Tom McClure (220), Bill Kennedy (880), Jim Davis (mile), Gary Stewart (high jump) and the mile relay foursome of Dick Pleuss, Dave Gauntlett, Mike Milford and Tom Webb.
