KALAMAZOO—Jack Cardinal of Flint St. Michael shot a 76 here Saturday for the second-best score in the annual State Class B high school golf tournament. Jim Carleton of Grand Lodge was medalist with 35-40—75.

Grand Blanc tied for fifth place in the 19-school tourney with 337, 16 strokes behind winner Alma (321). St. Johns (326), Kalamazoo University High (326) and East Grand Rapids (330) followed the champ in the tourney at Millham Park Golf Course.

For Grand Blanc, Jim Tubbs and Doug Main shot 42-39—81, Bolton Morrison 43-39—82 and Stu Mancour 48-45—93. It was Grand Blanc's best finish in history.

Clio's Morey Runs R

Outruns Alma's Bowen, Snaps 21-Year Standard

ANN ARBOR—A mile record clocking by Clio High's Gordon Morey was the standout performance by a Flint area athlete in Saturday's state Class B track meet at the University of Michigan's Ferry Field.

Morey outran Alma's great Jan Bowen, finishing in 4:25.6 to break the second oldest record in the books, a 4:28.2 clocking set by Ralph Brackrog of Mt. Morris in 1940.

Genesee County teams couldn't challenge winner Detroit Lutheran West (35 points) and Ecorse (30) for the team championship, but Flint area individuals took four firsts, three thirds and three fourth places.

FENTON FINISHED seventh in the 125-team field with 8½ points for the Flint area's best team standing. Bendle was 10th with 7, Kearsley 11th (6½), Clio 14th (6), Bentley 17th (5½), Grand Blanc 20th (5), Davison 41st (1) and Mandeville 48th (½).

It was fitting that Morey should break Brackrog's record. Brackrog was the only Genesee County athlete to hold a state Class B record, and Morey kept the mark in the Flint area.

Bowen, considered Michigan's best miler regardless of class going into the meet, took over the pace from Morey on the first lap and the two stayed together, outdistancing the rest of the field, until midway around the last lap.

Then Morey, who trailed Bowen by several strides, took over He rounded the last curve and broke the tape with about a 20-yard lead.

"HE WAS GREAT," said Clio Coach Fordy Kennedy, the ex-Michigan State distance star who once ran a 4.11.0 mile himself, only to finish fifth in a Big Ten meet "His time was faster by 12 seconds than his best previous clocking"

Bentley's great pole vaulter Rich Schlegelmilch shared first place with Mike Edwards of Lakeshore, each vaulting 12-4 After three misses, which made any further effort unofficial, both cleared 12-9, which would have been a record Then Schlegelmilch stayed to clear 13-1, a personal high

Martin Crane of Kearsley and Glenn Duddles of Grand Blanc each won state championships in the 440 Crane came from 15 yards behind to win the second heat in 51.1, and Duddles took the third heat in 51.4, also in a come-from-behind effort Clio's Jim Skinner took third in Duddles' heat

HAROLD HUFF OF Fenton and Dwight Robb of Bendle each won preliminary heats in the 100-yard dash, but Huff finished third be-

hind Craig LaGrone of Lutheran West and Barney Crouse of Cranbrook in the finals, and Robb was fifth.

Huff, who also won a preliminary 220 heat, finished fourth and Robb sixth in the finals of that event.

Robb also took a third in the broad jump (20-5¾) to become this-area's only competitor to score in three events.

Fred Thompson of Kearsley and Bob Bruder of Fenton tied for fourth with two others in the high jump, Terry Stoner of Mandeville tied for fifth in the pole vault and Davison's Clarence Rickard was sixth in the shot put to account for the rest of Genesee County contestants' points.

BESIDES MOREY'S mile record, Lutheran West's Jim Vogler set a 19.6 seconds record in the 180 low hurdles preliminaries and Paul Holmberg of Cass City set a 48.8-second mark in the 440. East Grand Rapids set an automatic 3:32.9 record in the mile relay, a new event.

Vogler was the only double winner, taking both the high and low hurdles, and would have set records in the finals of both points.

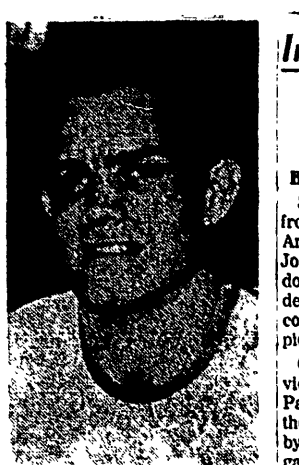
